### Legend

- P** Church has **P**arking spaces designated for persons with disabilities.  
**R** Church has **R**amps to facilitate access or is on same level with parking area.  
**A** Church has **A**isle and pew arrangements that can accommodate people in wheelchairs.  
**Y** Church has sanctuar**Y** which is accessible to people in wheelchairs.  
**W** Church has **W**ashrooms that are accessible to people in wheelchairs.  
**I** Church has **I**nterpreted services for deaf persons.  
**T** Church has **T**echnological devices (e.g. audio loops) for people with hearing loss.  
**H** Church has **H**ymnals or missalettes in braille or with large print for people with visual impairments.  
**U** Church has **U**shers who are trained to deal with the needs of persons with disabilities.  
**S** Church has **S**taff and/or parishioners in on-going ministry to implement the *Pastoral Statement of U.S. Catholic Bishops on People with Disabilities*.
