Diocesan Connection

NCPD works to ensure that at least one person in every diocese is trained to address disability concerns and is connected to a nation-wide network of pastoral leaders focusing on disability related matters. That way, even if someone is unaware of how to address



a situation, they can say, "I might not have a solution yet, but I know where we can go in the Church to find one." If at least one person in every diocese is connected to NCPD, the Church doors will remain open for persons with disabilities—their gifts will be valued, and their needs will be heard and responded to appropriately.

To accomplish this goal, NCPD has a Diocesan Affiliate program which provides an opportunity for Diocesan Affiliates to receive one-on-one training from NCPD staff, network with diocesan directors across the country, and receive the latest books and tools related to disability ministry. NCPD is also developing a mentoring program to match diocesan directors with years of experience with those new to the ministry.


