This year include hand-made items that remind everyone of Jesus' presence in our lives.

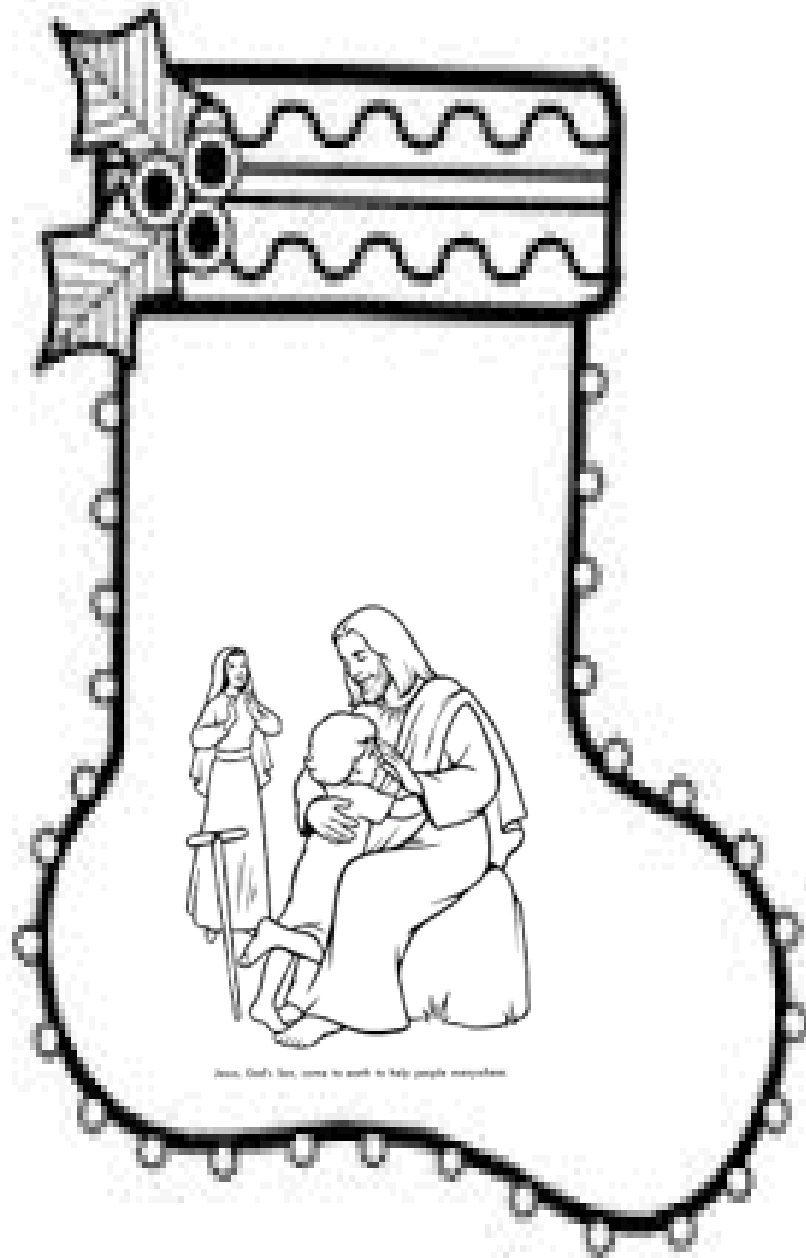
FAMILY RITUAL AND TRADITION (cont.)

Family members can cut out and decorate the following ornaments or create some of their own design.

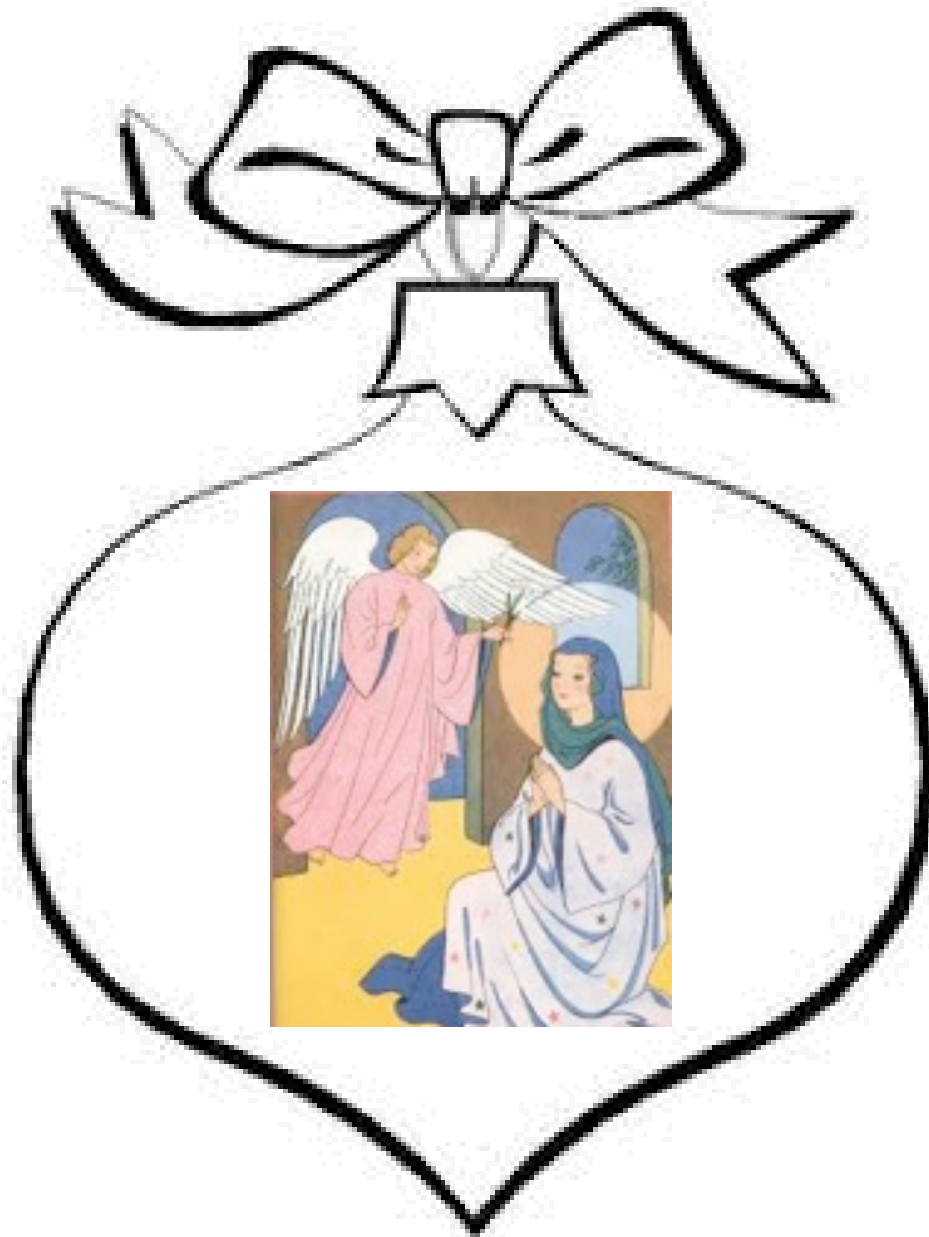
One side of the ornament can depict a moment of Jesus' time on earth.

The other side of the ornament can note what that moment means in our lives today.

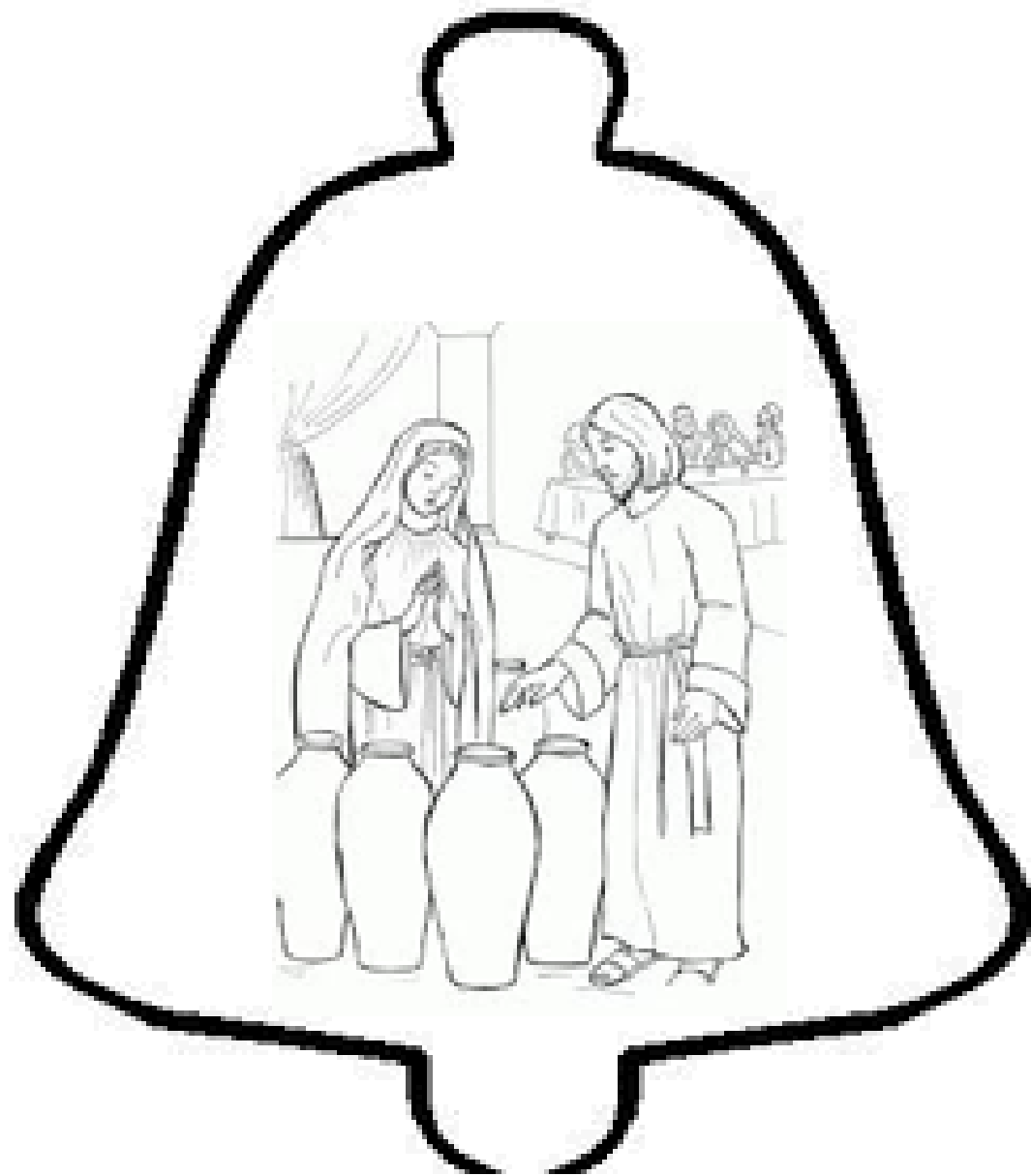

God Loves Families of All Kinds

God sent Jesus from heaven to share His love and blessings with all people.

Throughout Advent, we prepare for the arrival of Jesus on Christmas Day. One way we can prepare for Jesus' arrival is by bringing a bit of His love and blessings into the lives of others.





Service is a reflection of Jesus' love, kindness, and spirituality; it may be a simple gesture or something that is more involved.

Throughout December, try doing a service act once a day. Examples are:



FAMILY SERVICE

1. Compliment someone for a job well done.
2. Let someone ahead of you in line.
3. Make someone something to eat.
4. Share a treat with friends.
5. Help with a chore at home, school, or work.

FAMILY SERVICE

6. Read a bible story instead of watching a TV show or playing a computer game.
7. Draw a picture of the Nativity.
8. Talk to someone who is sitting alone.
9. Make a Christmas card for someone who may be lonely.
10. Thank someone for the things they do for you.



FAMILY SERVICE (cont.)

11. Support a local business.
12. Write a note complimenting someone on what you love about them.
13. Donate household items, food, clothes, toys to an organization that helps those in need.
14. Make a homemade gift for someone.
15. Watch a movie about Jesus' birth.



FAMILY SERVICE (cont.)

- 16. Be considerate of others while driving or waiting in line.
- 17. Pay for a stranger's coffee.
- 18. Start a collection for a charity.
- 19. Include someone in an activity who is by him/herself.
- 20. Leave happy notes in stores, on cars, at school or work.

FAMILY SERVICE (cont.)

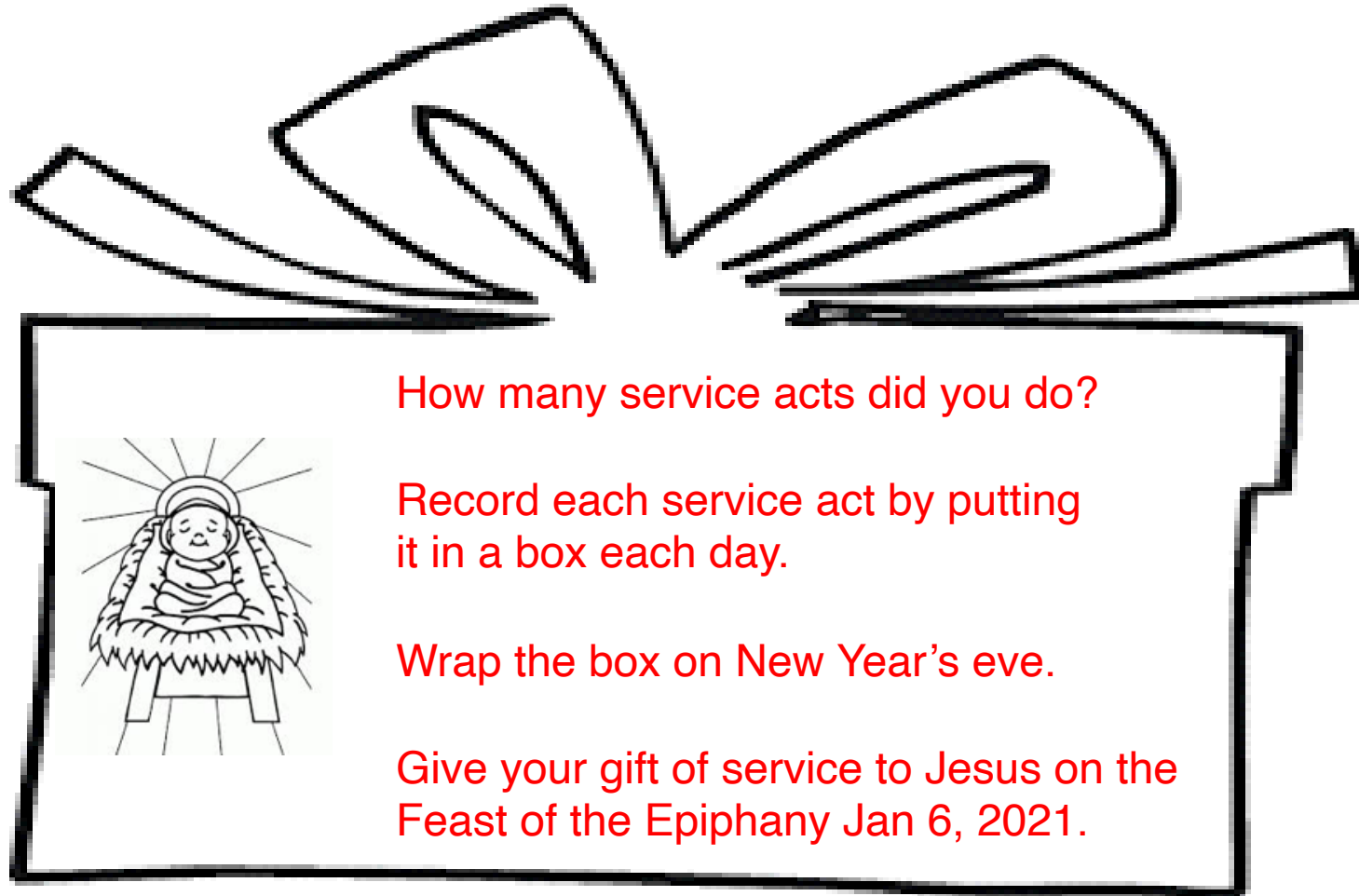
21. Say an extra prayer for someone.
22. Wave to others and wish them a Merry Christmas.
23. Sing Christmas carols in your neighborhood.
24. Help others prepare for Christmas.
25. Say something nice to someone who has hurt you.

- 26. Tell someone about the true meaning of Christmas.
- 27. Complete a chore without being asked and without complaining.
- 28. Make treats for volunteers or first responders.
- 29. Spend time with friends or family looking at old photos.

Having a Happy Heart at the Holidays

The holidays often bring change and with that routines can often be forgotten.

However, this is the time when routine becomes even more important, it allows for understanding and the ability to know what to expect.

Consistency and Routines

Communicate changes in the schedule.

Let children/adults with disabilities be a part of the planning process.

Understand their likes and dislikes, tailor experience to meet those needs.

Manage expectations and accept imperfection.

Remember to ask for help when needed, you are not alone.

Breathe, Pray, Repeat.



Tips and Tools

Keep it Simple

Make it fun, enjoyable and as simple as possible.

Do not over stress, humans are social beings and thrive off each others energy.

You know your family members the best, do what feels right to you.

If they get overstimulated easily, reduce the amount of stimulation (sound, lights, etc.)



Tips and Tools

Keep it Simple

Let everyone help.

Understand that everyone has their own way of doing something.

Do not stress the little things. Especially when it comes to decorating.

If a child does not like surprises, don't wrap gifts-use a bow instead.

Remember the reason for the season:

Spreading kindness, joy, and the good news of the Gospel.
