

Tips and Tools

TRANSITIONS from one activity to another can often be difficult for individuals with sensory issues. A great tool used in homes and classrooms is a TIMER.





Tips and Tools

If a person can visually see how long they have left to complete a task/assignment they are more at ease with the change that transitions bring.

Timers also work as a great way to make a practiced skill a competitive game. Who can say the Pledge of Allegiance the fastest...the slowest...

Improve reading skills with 1-minute timed reading tests to determine how many words they are reading per minute. Let mom and dad get into the fun too!
