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The Rosary

When we pray the Rosary, we reflect upon the life of Jesus, and his mother, Mary.

There are four different sets of Mysteries that can be prayed on the Rosary:

- 1. The Joyful Mysteries
- 2. The Sorrowful Mysteries
- 3. The Glorious Mysteries
- 4. The Luminous Mysteries

Each of these Mysteries has five different events.

One decade of the rosary is dedicated to each of the events.

CARING CONVERSATIONS

As a family, consider engaging in caring conversations around the Mysteries of the Rosary.

Make connections between the events depicted in the Mysteries with events in your family's lives.

Following are suggestions for conversations starters:



The Joyful Mysteries:

- 1. The Annunciation what was it like when you found out you were having a baby?
- 2. The Visitation talk about a special visit from someone who you'll always remember.
- 3. The Nativity describe the day a family member was born.
- 4. The Presentation in the Temple discuss preparing for a family member's Baptism.
- 5. The Finding in the Temple tell about a time you worried about losing someone.




The Luminous Mysteries:

- 1. The Baptism of Christ in the Jordan describe someone's Baptism celebration.
- 2. The Wedding Feast at Cana recall doing something challenging that your parent asked you to do.
- 3. Jesus' Proclamation of the Coming of the Kingdom of God how are you called to service for the Kingdom?
- 4. The Transfiguration when have you seen Jesus reflected in someone's actions?
- 5. The Institution of the Eucharist talk about a special time when you received the Eucharist.

Mary as Our Protector

The Virgin Mary always protects us with her motherly love. Every time we pray the last verse of the Hail Mary, "pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death," we are asking our Blessed Mother to keep us in her prayers throughout our lifetime.

For some family members, verbally praying the Hail Mary may be challenging to do. Keep in mind that praying can be done in many ways other than the spoken word.

Following are a few optional ways to pray the Hail Mary.



Mary as Our Protector

- Family members can pray the Hail Mary by simply gazing at the images on the following pages.
- Individuals can join others in prayer by pointing to the pictures while family members read the corresponding verses out loud.
- Cut out the large pictures on the following pages. Ask family members to select or hold a card during the beginning, middle, and end of the prayer.
- Ask family members to sequence the larger pictures in the order of the prayer.
- Allow individuals to color or decorate the prayer pictures.

Activity – Make a noodle rosary

Supplies Needed:

- 2 pool noodles of different colors. (One for the "Hail Mary" beads, and one for the "Our Fathers." Using a third color for the cross is optional). I used 1 pool noodle that was flower shaped, and one that was not.
- Clothes lines (or any small rope)
- Scissors
- Bread knife (or other serrated knife)
- Glue gun

FAMILY SERVICE

Throughout the month of October, your family may want to consider "praying" the Rosary by participating in service activities.

Take turns coloring in a rosary bead every time a family member does a good deed, performs an act of kindness, or completes a service activity for others.

Place the picture of the rosary on the following page in a place in your home that is frequently seen by family members: the refrigerator is a good location. Watch the Rosary being prayed as each bead is colored.



FAMILY SERVICE (con't.)


Options:
