Your Excellency,

The National Catholic Partnership on Disability (NCPD) continues its work to implement the directives set forth by the Bishops in your 1978 *Pastoral Statement of U.S. Catholic Bishops on Persons with Disabilities (Pastoral Statement)*. As you know, we lead the Church's national ministry – for persons with disabilities to be nurtured throughout our U.S. Catholic Church. We are all one through the body of Christ, yet many faith-filled Catholics with disabilities do not feel that they belong. Many continue to have a *Longing for Belonging*.

This year we celebrate forty years of bringing the *Pastoral Statement* to life. We also are transitioning to the next phase of NCPD's rich history under new leadership as our long-time executive director, Janice Benton, prepares for her retirement.

Support for NCPD from U.S. (arch)dioceses is particularly critical right now. As you may know, a significant portion of our budget comes from contributions (we call affiliate sponsorships) from U.S. (arch)dioceses. As described below, we need your support and ask for your consideration to:
